¹ The first six indicators are the key components of Worldwide Governance Indicators (WGI) a research dataset summarizing the views on the quality of governance provided by a large number of enterprises, citizen and expert survey respondents in industrial and developing countries. The range is between -2.5 (the worst) to +2.5 (the best).

² CPI is an index published annually by Transparency International which ranks countries between by their perceived levels of public sector corruption. The country's score varies from 100 (very clean) and 0 (highly corrupt).

³ The index measures the degree of economic freedom in the world's nations. It ranges the countries based on the following criteria: Free (75–100), Mostly Free (70–74.9), Moderately Free (65–69.9), Moderately Free (60–64.9), Mostly Unfree (55–59.9), Mostly Unfree (50–54.9), Repressed (0–49.9).

⁴ The EGDI is based on a comprehensive Survey of the online presence of all 193 United Nations Member States, which assesses national websites and how e-government policies and strategies are applied in general and in specific sectors for delivery of essential services.

⁵ The HDI is a statistic composite index of life expectancy, education, and per capita income indicators, which are used to rank countries into four tiers of human development (1= the best)

⁶ Gender Gap Index ranks countries according to calculated gender gap between women and men in four key areas: health, education, economy and politics to gauge the state of gender equality in a country (1= the best).

⁷ The Doing Business index provides objective measures of business regulations and their enforcement across 190 economies and selected cities at the subnational and regional level (100 = the best).
